# Message from the Minister

As I sit writing this, I am remembering the leaves mixing with pine needles that cascaded down in my yard of my Massachusetts home, where I lived for nearly forty years. The hues in my yard were mostly yellows and orangey browns, looking not unlike those decorations they sell in craft stores out here in California, to make us think it's autumn. I remember the wild turkeys that would be pecking through the pine needles and the squirrels rushing about storing the bounteous crop of acorns for the winter ahead. In New England this is a bittersweet time of year. On the one hand, one is surrounded by the spectacular beauty that only a New England autumn can bring; on the other, we know that colder and messier days are on the way, ice on the roads and snow to shovel. I have to say I love our weather here in Santa Paula but I also do miss the change of seasons and the variety that they can bring.

Here in our congregation we will mark our fall with a traditional Day of the Dead service on October 30, which is our Unitarian Universalist version of what our friends may mark as All Soul's Day or All Saint's Day, coming at the same time as Halloween. It is a sort of hodge-podge mixing of Christianity, the secular, and age old rituals celebrating the deaths of ancestors. Together we will create an altar of pictures and artifacts that remind us of those who came before us. I know I will be bringing pictures of my late parents, Harold and Lina MacNeill, and I will look forward to seeing what you may bring. Later this fall we once more consider all we are grateful for on Thanksgiving, a secular holiday, but one that we will mark in our congregation with a corn bread communion. In addition, we will be hosting the Santa Paula Thanksgiving Interfaith Service later that same day, and we will need folks to help greet our neighbors. We have a lot to be grateful for and why wait for November to consider it! There is an impetus that I believe we feel to gather together and give thanks in community—both in church but especially in our families, whether our families of origin or our chosen families of friends. Life is a complicated combination of happiness and sadness, joys and sorrows. That is not news to any of us. I like to think that our weekly sharing of joys and sorrows go a long way towards holding us, caring for us and making us truly seen by each other. And I am aware each week of those in our community who are not in the sanctuary whose joys and concerns we also hold, even though they may be unspoken. May we share our memories of loved ones and share our love here with each other.

# Message from the RE Coordinator

Last month the kids had fun becoming familiar with the chalice as the symbol of our Unitarian Universalist faith. The picture below shows the children creating their own chalice out of clay. Teacher Lana took the chalices home and baked them in the oven so the kids will be able to keep their chalice for months to come.

We finished up our teddy bear series by teaching the children about caring for one another when we feel sick. Sometimes getting sick or having loved ones get sick can be a scary thing for preschoolers. We gently introduced the potentially scary subject of illness by having the kids make a bed for their teddy bears so they can comfort them when they get sick.

In our last teddy bear session, we taught the children that sharing with friends makes us less afraid. By using a third party – teddy bears – we helped the children talk in a nonthreatening way about how it feels to be lost or scared.



We played a fun memory game on September 18. Teacher Lana took photos of important things in and around the church such as Reverend Maddie, rose bushes from our memorial garden, and the RE chalice and then made a card game for all to play. 

### ALL CHURCH READ 2016 - 2017

The Common Read of the Unitarian Universalist Association this coming year is "*The Third Reconstruction: Moral Mondays, Fusion Politics, and the Rise of a New Justice Movement*", by The



Rev. Dr. William Barber II and Jonathan Wilson-Hartgrove (Beacon, 2016). Unitarian Universalists were electrified at General Assembly 2016 by Rev. Barber's call for building and sustaining a movement for justice for all people. The Common Read selection committee believes that this is a moment for Unitarian Universalists to answer that call.

**The Third Reconstruction** offers helpful, practical guidance for engaging with justice movements born in response to local experiences of larger injustices. Drawing on the prophetic traditions of the Jewish and Christian scriptures, while making room for other sources of truth, the book challenges us to ground our justice work in moral dissent, even when there is no reasonable expectation of political success, and to do the hard work of coalition building in a society that is fractured and polarized.

We will have a discussion of the book in 2017 but you may like to purchase or borrow the book to begin reading now. A paperback edition is available for purchase at inSpirit: UU Book and Gift Shop, from Amazon or your favorite bookseller and there are two copies available to borrow in the Parish Hall.


