Message from the Minister

Our theme for the month of February this year is Love. Erich Fromm, the social psychologist who wrote the famous book, "The Art of Loving" contrasts infantile love with mature love. "Infantile love follows the principle: 'I love because I am loved.' Mature love: 'I am loved because I love.' Immature love says: 'I love you because I need you.' Mature love says: 'I need you because I love you."

Roberto Vargas, the speaker at the recent Santa Paula Tribute to Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., paraphrased King's thinking about love: Dr. King spoke of the 3 forms of love, eros, the romantic love, philia, the love within friendship, and agape, the profound love for each other as members of our human community. In the indigenous tradition, there is also *porvida* love, which includes all others and the love for Mother Earth and justice for all. I would add from the Christian tradition the importance of loving your neighbor as yourself...which presupposes loving yourself! We love our selves by being conscious what food and drink we consume, how we take care of our bodies, attending to our spiritual lives, balancing our work and home lives and more. One way we love ourselves is planning for the unforeseen-whether it is being prepared for emergencies like the recent fire or an earthquake, an unexpected medical emergency, or an accident. One of the roles that faith communities play is being there for its members and friends at those unexpected times. Our Caring Committee addresses some of these situations and can do more. We are hoping to become more able to coordinate rides to church for those who need them on Sunday mornings or other events. We know there will be time when a member needs shopping done for them or the time honored "casserole brigade." Please let me know if you are interested in loving our community in that way.

Another way of loving ourselves is letting our church community know how to reach our closest friend or family member in the case of an emergency or with instructions I can use at the end of life. Please fill out the form in this newsletter or get one from the table in the Parish Hall. If you only want to fill out the emergency contact at this time, that is fine. All filled out forms are confidential and kept in my locked files. Come let us love one another—and ourselves.

Famous UUs in History



Abigail Adams was the first Second Lady and the second First Lady of the United States. She was also the first First Lady to be the mother of a President. But aside from that tongue-twister of a historical description, she was also a fierce advocate for abolition and women's rights. In letters to her husband during the Continental Congress, she advocated strongly for her beliefs in women's property rights, as well as her view that slavery was the biggest risk to the new republic; it took decades for her views to become the laws of the land.

As a member of First Parish Church in Quincy, MA, she was essentially a life-long Unitarian, as the church had renounced Trinitarian views in 1753. In a letter to her daughter-in-law, Louisa Adams, that shows much in common with what many modern UUs believe, she wrote the following:

When will Mankind be convinced that true Religion is from the Heart, between Man and his creator, and not the imposition of Man or creeds and tests?

Daniel Newman-Lessler is the conductor of the Kadima Senior and Conservatory Philharmonics, assistant conductor of the Los Angeles Zimriyah Chorale, assistant conductor of the California State University Channel Islands University Choir, music director of the Pleasant Valley School District Chorus, and music director of the Temple Ner Ami Choir. He recently served as the assistant conductor for the Santa Barbara Symphony's 2017-

18 season opening concerto: *Mozart in Dance*, and until recently, was the pianist for the Singer Chamber Players.

Daniel received a Master of Music in Sacred Music from the University of Southern California Thornton School of Music, where he also graduated magna cum laude with a Bachelor's in Music in Piano Performance with emphases in composition and conducting. While at Thornton, Daniel received a Board of Councilors Mentorship, Discovery Scholarship, Town and Gown Scholarship, and Skull and Dagger Society Scholarship.

In addition to his studies at USC, Daniel has studied conducting, composition, and piano at the: Idyllwild Arts Academy; International Summer Academy of Music in Ochsenhausen, Germany; Franz Liszt Academy of Music in Sopron, Hungary; Oregon Bach Festival with Helmuth Rilling; Los Angeles Conductors Workshop with Kenneth Kiesler; and the Conductors Retreat at Medomak in Maine, also with Kenneth Kiesler.

Daniel has sung in live and recorded performances with Andrea Bocelli, Natalie Cole, Jennifer Hudson, Mary J. Blige, and David Foster at the Nokia Theatre, Capitol Records, and Paramount Pictures.

As a pianist, Daniel has won the SYMF and MTAC concerto competitions, repeatedly performed as a soloist with the Thousand Oaks Philharmonic and performed chamber music throughout Southern California with the Singer Chamber players. He has performed piano on the sixth season of *Glee* and as a panelist for MTAC. He regularly performs benefit concerts, which have included fundraisers for the Boys and Girls Club of Camarillo, Planned Parenthood, and the Channel Islands Choral Association to provide after-school choral music education. He has served as the Music Director of the Harmony for Humanity Daniel Pearl World Music Days Festival in Camarillo for ten years.
