BOARD NOTES

Did you know our church has been invaded by an invasive species that came from subtropical Asia to North America in the 1980s? You may have noticed some bird "poop" on the east side of the church. - ❖ The 2nd Quarter First Sunday Recipient is The Canine Adoption and Rescue League (C.A.R.L)
- Canine Adoption and Rescue League (C.A.R.L.) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit all breed, no-kill dog rescue and adoption organization. Since 1996, C.A.R.L. has rescued and placed thousands of unwanted, sick, abandoned, and homeless dogs. Dogs in our adoption program are placed in pre-screened, loving and secure homes. We make a lifetime commitment to all of our dogs.
- ❖ C.A.R.L is located in Santa Paula, California and primarily serves Ventura County dogs. Because of our lifetime commitment to our dogs we have a preference to place dogs locally, so we are available to them if needed. We rely on donations and do not receive government, state, or city funding. We operate almost entirely by volunteers.
- ❖ C.A.R.L. has established "CARL's Golden Oldies", a new rescue program focusing specifically on the unique needs of dogs aged 10 and older. Senior dogs have so much to give. They are calm and patient, affectionate and loyal. All they ask in return is the same love and care deserving of any pet and a warm place to rest their head.
- ❖ These animals deserve to spend their remaining time in safe, loving, and secure homes. Those homes will be enriched and brightened by the presence of a loyal companion, one who is often already house trained, calm, and used to the company of people and other pets. Senior citizens who could not otherwise afford the medical bills of a senior dog are encouraged to foster these dogs.
- C.A.R.L's Golden Oldies program funding has run out and they are currently seeking help to keep maintaining medical care for the older dogs in the program as well as roofs to keep the dogs dry when it rains. Currently their roofs are in dis-array and they have a quote to fix these but are still about \$10,000 short. Anything you can do to help would be amazing

CASP, a non-profit organization, provides a Food Pantry to serve the disadvantaged of Santa Paula. CRIMES AND MISDEMEANORS

If ever a film attempted to find a way to address the moral ambiguities of film noir in a contemporary setting, it is this 1989 drama by Woody Allen. 

COMMITTEE ON CONGREGATIONAL LIFE

According to the Bylaws of the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula, the Committee on Congregational Life's primary mission to evaluate the overall effectiveness of the congregation's ministry (ordained, staff and laity). The COCL is not a committee of the Board, but a committee of the congregation in special relationship to the Board. It consists of three members serving staggered terms of two years each. Current members are Judy Triem, chair, Ken Stock and Audrey Vincent. COCL meetings are held in the context of confidentiality and mutual honesty. Members are encouraged to let Rev. Maddie or one of the members of the committee know if there are any issues of the ministry of the congregation of which they should be aware. The COCL created and the congregation adopted its Covenant of Right Relations during the Interim Ministry period before Rev. Maddie was called and reviews it annually, as well as periodically publishing it in the newsletter as a reminder to all our members and friends.

LISTENING AND SPEAKING

Listen from the heart. Use "I" statements when expressing opinions or feelings. In conversation, refrain from blame and judgment. Listen more to understand than to reply. Leave space for others to speak / let your voice be heard (or as our Youth say), "Step Up / Step Back". Respect different points of view.

WORKING WITH CONFLICT

We promise to address conflicts directly, using openness and compassion.

Assume others have good intentions. Talk to the person directly. Stay engaged with each other through difficult conversations. Be curious about the other side of an issue. Agree to disagree and do so with openness and gentleness. Respect decisions made by the group.

Greet people warmly. Engage those who are different from us. Welcome newcomers into conversations. At Coffee Hour be intentionally inclusive. Treat others with respect and loving kindness.

We promise to acknowledge our shortcomings and be willing to forgive those of others.

Acknowledge our own and others' imperfections. Forgive ourselves and others. Lovingly call each other to account for behavior that is hurtful to others. Treat each other with openness, honesty and fairness.

We promise t acknowledge the service of others and support each other in times of joy and need.

Honor all levels of service and financial support to the church. Help each other in time of crisis. Recognize each other's talents. Appreciate the efforts of others. Give positive feedback, comments and thoughts. Stay open to other points of view. Challenge ourselves and each other to grow.
