How are you doing with your summer plans? My vacation and study leave turned out to be less restful than anticipated, with a good amount of “go with the flow” involved—but I guess that is like life! Despite planning things down to the day, some shifts happened as a long time yearly Fourth of July gathering was canceled, along with some other things, and others were added. The highpoints included the two concerts, one with my accordion player Richard Conti at an assisted living facility I have been performing at for more than 15 years and a house concert with my band TVS (The Vocal Section). Other high points were two weddings, one at Wellesley College and one in Lexington on the Freedom Trail.

I am beginning research on Universalists in Maine, especially as concerns some of our founders. Sitting in Peter’s tree lined study, I realized that my interest in our founders and early Universalism will send me down a lengthy but interesting path over the next few years. I will hope to get to Caribou on another trip as it is at the very northern tip of Maine, pointing to the interior of New Brunswick. Peter did give me a picture of the church which you can see along with pictures of our congregations in Pittsfield and Waterville.

May the rest of your summer send you down unexpected and intriguing paths.

This year will be following the UUA Tapestry of Faith, Chalice Children curriculum. The authors of the curriculum are Katy Covey and Pat Kahn and they claim the purpose of the program is to introduce the basic tenets of our UU faith to young children and their families. Those tenets are love, our covenantal community, our celebration of diversity, a personal sense of wonder and awe, and our hope and work for a better world. The curriculum is geared towards preschool children between the ages of 2-5 years. "In the preschool years, at about four or five years old, young children start to realize that they and their loved ones will come to an end. As they become aware of realities such as death, suffering, violence, and evil, young ones also need the reassurance of love, joy, beauty, good, hope, and community. Helping children find that balance is a goal of the Chalice Children curriculum." This "Slither" is not that movie about snakes! The title is apropos of nothing, which pretty much describes the entire thing. James Caan plays a dim-bulb ex-con who inadvertently gets himself involved in a hunt for a pile of filched cash, and finds himself in league with world's flakiest stickup artist (Sally Kellerman) and a small-time con man (Peter Boyle). Most of what happens next makes very little sense, but it's a lot of fun to watch. Hardly anyone saw this film when it was released in 1973, but it deserves to be remembered as one of the more underrated comedies of the decade. Not because it's deep (far from it), but because this '70s take on the screwball comedies of earlier decades was made to be so unapologetically silly during a period when filmmakers were earnestly in pursuit of realism and relevancy. The snappy direction is by Howard Zieff, who made his name shooting funny TV commercials. It shows, but in a good way. A worthy summer diversion. (1:37)
