### **CHOIR AND RISE UP SINGING**

Early in 2020, the Social Concerns Action Committee voted to support the 2020 Census project, budgeting \$50. for use at an event focused on that effort. The event did not happen, but we continue to be supportive by using this space to educate ourselves about the census and how important it is for our home place, the Santa Clara River Valley.

Read Dr. Aguirre's words to learn how the census helps every one of us.

Did you know you are worth \$2,000? Read on!

#### Census 2020 Update for Universalist Unitarian Church Prepared by Dr. Gabino Aguirre\*

The census, which happens every ten years, determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress, and how 800 billion dollars in federal funding gets spent. Schools, roads, health and medical services, disaster relief, and other important things in our community will gain – or lose – funding over the next ten years depending on the official population count. Each person's participation equates to \$2000 per year funding for healthcare facilities and emergency services, children's nutritional programs, housing and education programs and economic development and jobs creation among others. This is a very big deal, and everyone needs to participate.

The census is required by law and all residents, regardless of citizenship, must participate. For the very first time, the census will primarily rely on the Internet for participation. This is one of several barriers that inhibit registration. Others include lack of technology, limited or no broadband access, lack of familiarity with using the internet, mistrust of federal government, fear that personal information will be used against them, and limited English ability.

Locally, various partners are actively promoting a full and accurate count including the US Census Bureau, CA Census 2020, County of Ventura and the Ventura County Community Foundation. Achieving an accurate count in this year of the COVID-19 pandemic has been particularly challenging. With shelterin-place restrictions, the campaign pivoted toward no-contact strategies using direct mail, utility inserts, social media, phone-banking, text messaging, videos and information dissemination at food-distribution centers. Besides participating via the Internet, individuals can also register by phone and completing a paper questionnaire.

All of these outreach activities are focused on areas and population groups that have been traditionally hard to count. In Ventura County, the focus is on the Oxnard, Port Hueneme and the Santa Clara Valley. Self-response closes on October 31st which is only 13 weeks from now. Currently, Ventura County is 4th in the state. We are getting close to the goal of having 75% of the County counted before Census Bureau enumeration begins. As of July 9, 2020, Santa Paula was at 68% and Fillmore was at 66.5%.

\*Dr. Aguirre is the Census Coordinator for Region 5 which includes the coastal counties of Santa Cruz, San Benito, Monterey, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara and Ventura.
