
September 27 Sea Change and Reinvention

Message from the Minister

September is the time when normally we are gearing up for a new church year in our historic sanctuary, the choir is warming up their voices, the coffee hours are filled with new energy and we start planning for our Fall Canvas, Faith Formation activities, our concert series and all the things that make us run around here as a congregation. We connect and reconnect with those we have known for many years and with those who decide to check out our congregation at the start of a "new year." It is a time where historically we refocus our energies as we head into autumn. It is also a time when we head into a new year in our calendar of themes from the Touchstones Project. This past church year of 2019-2020 had the over-arching theme of Building Beloved Community. I like to think that your staff, leadership, and I have made a great effort to keep our beloved community together in this unexpected time of COVID-19, especially for a very small congregation. Our Touchstones theme for the upcoming year is Deepening Connection. How can we deepen our connections to each other and our larger community, even in this time of quarantine, isolation and social distancing? How can we honor the Worth and Dignity of each one of us while centering those voices on the margins and appreciating the community as a whole?

I have been thinking a lot about the power of ritual in our lives as part of the way we make connection (and how we can do it over Zoom!). Some folks say that UUs don't have ritual, but we actually do! Our basic Order of Service each Sunday is a ritual; it is our liturgy at the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula and how we connect with what some call the holy or sacred. Service elements such as singing the Doxology melody (with whatever text we can use at this time without infringing on copyrights) and reciting the Covenant of the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula that others before us adapted to fit this congregation are other aspects of our ritual. Lighting the chalice and even ringing our bell are all rituals. Each September we begin the year with a Water Communion and near the end of the regular church year we have a Flower Communion—more rituals. This year one of our themes has been the eight Sabbats or Rituals from the earth-based traditions which is one of the Six Sources we draw from as Unitarian Universalist. The next one of the eight, Mabon, takes place in September and is a harvest festival that is celebrated on the Autumnal Equinox of each year.

What rituals do you celebrate or mark in your lives? Come let us deepen our connections with those rituals we can craft together. See you in Zoom church.

Maddie, Erik Halseth, Ken Stock, Karen Harris representing the board, Pat English on fiduciary safety, Krystal Johnson from the staff and our friend Sharon Kufeldt. The next meeting is September 2 at Noon on Zoom and will be led by Erik Halseth, Chair. The Safe Congregation Team reports and is advisory to the Board.

Be Wary of Scammer Emails!

As you may have read before, we occasionally deal with scammer emails. These are emails that look like they are coming from Rev. Maddie, UUCSP staff, or in some cases, from other congregation members or friends. They may ask you "if you have a moment to speak," or reference some extreme predicament they are experiencing. Some may say that they do not want to speak on the phone, or they will say they are in a meeting or prayer session. They will likely ask you to send them money through gift cards or through the computer. Please be aware that these emails are spam messages. SOCIAL CONCERNS ACTION COMMITTEE

MEETING: The Social Concerns Action Committee will meet Wednesday, September 9, 4:00 PM to do ongoing work of social justice and "to promote the principles of democracy by working for a sustainable, just and fair world." One way we have been doing justice work is supporting LUCHA, a local non-profit organization, and the food distribution project they co-sponsor with Poder Popular ("Power of the People"). Poder Popular is an ongoing cultural and services organization begun by immigrant women some 15 years ago when a few women began to advocate for programs that focused on issues of domestic violence, economic self-sufficiency and health and nutrition. Poder Popular also sponsors various educational projects supported by the Mexican Consulate in Oxnard benefiting qualified special students. Also, this organization is collaborating with the county health department in a "COVID Education and Protection Initiative" to help prevent the spread of this terrible disease. You may have seen Poder Popular in regional Mexican or Central American dress as when they have participated in the Labor Day Parade.

We have invited Dr. Gabino Aguirre to attend our September meeting to tell us more about this amazing, organically grown group that serves our immigrant population as well as the general public.


<u>3rd QUARTER FIRST SUNDAY PLATE OFFERING</u>




