#### PHISHING: DON'T TAKE THE BAIT—A REMINDER

The crooks don't take Sabbaticals or summer vacations! Always be sure that your email is coming from the correct address from the church or your friends and not one that is made up to look like it might be from someone you know. Someone calls the church office describing an emergency, claiming to be a staff member or leader. They have been robbed and need money wired to them ASAP. Or congregation members receive emails that are requesting gift card donations for a charitable cause. Religious groups and congregations are becoming easy targets for these types of scams. Hackers are getting more sophisticated every day. The best defense is to pause and look for warning signs before responding to any unsolicited email. Phishing is a form of "social engineering," whereby a hacker with bad intentions sends an email (or text or phone call) pretending to be someone the recipient trusts and asks the recipient to take an action which can have adverse effects. Sometimes, they request money. Other times, they invite the recipient to click a link or open an attachment that can trigger malicious code. A good rule of thumb with emails you're not expecting is to: (1) reach out to the sender through another channel (call, text, visit website) and (2) not click on a link (or send money, gift cards, etc.) without clarifying from the trusted source. A gift card scam has been making the rounds of churches of all denominations. Related scams can include unsolicited telephone calls that try to trick you into sending money or giving your private financial information. If it sounds too good to be true, it is! Be safe.

#### SPIRITUAL GROWTH CENTER

Rev. Maddie created the Spiritual Growth Center at the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula when she arrived in January 2015. During the last two years of pandemic, the only three activities that have continued have been the Gathering, Yoga on Tuesday and Thursday mornings with Lisa Hammond and our Meditation Practice Group with Rev. Maddie alternating with psychologist Jim Cole. In the past, we have offered End of Life planning, Singing Meditation, evenings with teacher Gurdeep Singth, and we were about to add another meditation group on Monday evening as well as hosting some Sound Baths. The Spiritual Growth Center is meant to include our adult religious education offerings and spiritual practices, providing opportunities and programs to awaken and sustain love, compassion, service, and personal transformation. Our goal is to help individuals discover how spiritual practice, learning, and community service can transform their lives and move the world toward peace and justice. Our programs are guided by the set of Seven Principles of Unitarian Universalism and the Six Sources they draw from. One of the Principles affirms our intention to accept one another and encourage each other's spiritual growth. As we prepare to open up more fully, please let Rev. 

# The Santa Paula Cinema Society Centennial Silent Comedy Shootout!

his month marks the 100th film in our SPCS series that began way back in March 2012! Who guessed it would go on this long? Since it's had such unexpectedly great legs, this seems like the perfect opportunity for a retrospective, which is taking the form of three films made exactly 100 years ago by the "big three" of silent comedy. Choosing to screen only films made by Chaplin, Keaton and Lloyd in this one, arbitrary year turns out not to be not such a random idea. By the early 1920s dramatic films were already being made at feature length, but nobody then was certain audiences would sit still for an hour or more of comedy. Of the three, Charlie Chaplin was the first to take the chance of making a feature ("The Kid" in 1921), and with its success the following year he released his very last short "Pay Day," and it will be the first film on our triple-bill. Not to be outdone, that same year Harold Lloyd made his first feature "Grandma's Boy," and it comes up second. In 1922 Buster Keaton was a year away from releasing his first two feature films, and so the lineup will feature one of his last shorts, "Cops." Who was the greatest of them all a hundred years ago? That's up to you, but it should be a lot of laughs trying to decide! (Total running time, 93 minutes).

#### **COMMITTEE ON CONGREGATIONAL LIFE**





#### ALL CHURCH READ PART TWO: DEFUND FEAR



A group of us had an interesting discussion of *Defund Fear: Safety Without Policing, Prisons and Punishment* by Zach Norris (Beacon Press: 2021). We realized that there were others who wanted to read the book and more to discuss. The Social Concern Action Committee has agreed to buy three copies of the book. Please let Rev. We will briefly review the first session and move to discussing what needs to be done to address the harms discussed in the book, building a culture of care and why we as Unitarian Universalists in particular are called to this work.


Zach Norris shifts the conversation about public safety away from fear and punishment and toward growth and support systems for our families and communities. In *Defund Fear*, Norris explores what has gone wrong, and why, and who has been most impacted by repressive and racist policing systems. He offers a new blueprint for public safety that holds people accountable while still holding them in community. Norris is a lawyer, a community organizer, and Executive

Director of the Ella Baker Center for Human Rights in Oakland, California. <u>Learn about the Center's work</u> and <u>read his bio</u>. 
