Message from the Minister

At this time of year, we all wish one another Happy New Year! After having made our lists and checked them twice for Christmas or buying gifts for the days of Hanukkah (or avoiding gift giving altogether), many of us make lists of resolutions for how we are going to start anew in the opening days of the year. Even if we don't, knowing that we are doomed most often to failing our best resolve by the end of January, it is a time to take stock of where we have been, where we are, and where we might be going. Maybe setting our intentions is a better way to put it. Letting go of what no longer serves us. We often start with our food choices, resolving to make more healthy ones in the New Year. Or we resolve to spend more time at the gym, start working with a personal trainer or take a lap around the neighborhood. Or resolve to spend more time with family and friends now that it is safer to do so. We might even resolve to attend our faith community more often—ministers, priests and rabbis love that one! Or we may resolve to spend more time on our personal spiritual life, learning to meditate, learn yoga or another spiritual practice.

In my work as a minister, I have officiated at many rites of passages, from the joy of weddings and child dedications to times of sadness such as funerals and memorial services. In that role I often hear from folks that they are “spiritual but not religious.” What is clear to me is that we each have an inner life which is our spiritual core, however we dress it up for the holidays—or don't. That core needs nourishment and exercise as much or more than our physical body. It needs tending and feeding. It needs paying attention to, listening for the still, small voice that is there if we can but quiet down enough to listen, to pay attention. And where you or I find your food, this coming year may be different than last year, for our needs change as the years go by. My parents, who lived to be almost 100 and 98 years old, respectively, changed how they met their spiritual needs as they aged. My father was raised Baptist and my mother Episcopalian. They shared a great love of church, and especially the music of the church. Their personal theology was Bible based and not very complicated. They couldn't make head nor tails of much of what I studied in seminary, but they were very happy that their daughter was studying to be a minister after an early life touring in rock bands! (That rock band singer is still in there somewhere and helps me see through a lot of things that people think they are hiding from the minister!). Towards the end of their lives, where they saw God was in nature. Their cognitive processes could no longer follow the liturgy of the church, but they saw God in the way the light shined through the trees and the birds that flitted in the bushes outside their windows. So do many of us.

John O'Donohue, Irish poet, author, and priest who is best known for bringing Celtic Spirituality to a popular audience, wrote these words “For a new beginning:”

In out-of-the-way places of the heart,
Where your thoughts never think to wander,
This beginning has been quietly forming,
Waiting until you were ready to emerge.
For a long time, it has watched your desire,
Feeling the emptiness growing inside you,
Noticing how you will yourself on,
Still unable to leave what you had outgrown.

I wish for all of us the courage to leave what we have outgrown and embrace a new rhythm for a new year. Find ways to feed your spirit, whether in your own practice or your faith community. “For, as O'Donahue tells us, “your soul senses the world that awaits you.”

Board of Trustees

The Annual Meeting of the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula will be held via Zoom at 12:30 p.m. on January 29, 2023 - after the Sunday Service and a short break. Election of three Board Trustees, two Capital Fund Trustees, one Cash Reserve Fund Trustee, two Committee on Congregational Life members, and next year's Nominating Committee team will occur.

In addition to the elections, we will vote to adopt our 2023 operating budget and several updates to our bylaws. We will hear from our Minister, and several committees will augment their written reports. Those written reports, the budget, proposed bylaws changes, and complete agenda, along with the minutes of the 2022 Annual Meeting (the "packet") will be sent via email to members after the Board of Trustees accepts the budget submitted by the Finance Committee, which should happen at the January 19 regular board meeting.

During the Zoom Annual Meeting – and we will reiterate this at the time – folks will be muted, except for the designated speaker. There is just no way to hear more than one person at a time. Of course, we are not literally silencing anyone! Our technology team will be watching for questions, nominations, raised hands and such, and there is the chat feature on Zoom. All who wish to, will be heard.

If you are one who normally blocks their camera during services, we will need you to be visible during the meeting so that we know who is in attendance. Our bylaws require a quorum be present at any meeting of the congregation, and we will be using screen view to verify that everyone is who they seem to be. Thank you for your cooperation.

If you require a printed packet be mailed to you, please advise our Office Administrator Krystal. It should arrive by post with plenty of time for you to familiarize yourself with it. Emailed packets should arrive about a week prior to the meeting. Please make sure that the church office has your current address.

Those who submit reports for the Annual Meeting packets should all have been notified that the deadline for submission is January 04, 2023. If you haven't already done so, please send your report in Microsoft Word or plain text format to Krystal at uucspoffice@gmail.com

We ask those who give verbal reports at the meeting to not repeat what is in their printed reports, but to make any additional comments or answer any queries from the congregation. Thank you again for your understanding.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH CENTER

Rev. Maddie created the Spiritual Growth Center at the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula when she arrived in January 2015. We are grateful that during the pandemic we were able to continue Gathering and meditation via Zoom and Facebook and that yoga returned after a short hiatus, starting outdoors and then moving back into the Parish Hall. We are continuing to open up post-pandemic. We now have two meditation groups, the original one on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 PM alternating between in person with Rev. Maddie and online with Jim Cole and since last fall, Monday evenings at 6:00 PM in person with Corrine Carson. We are adding occasional Sound Baths and other activities. The Spiritual Growth Center is meant to include our adult religious education offerings and spiritual practices, providing opportunities and programs to awaken and sustain love, compassion, service, and personal transformation. Our goal is to help individuals discover how spiritual practice, learning, and community service can transform their lives and move the world toward peace and justice. Our programs are guided by the set of Seven Principles of Unitarian Universalism and the Six Sources they draw from. 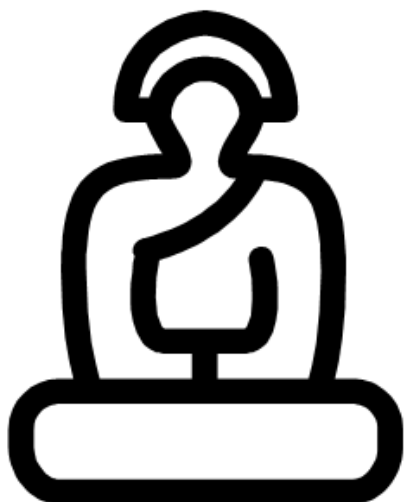

2023 1st QUARTER 1st SUNDAY OFFERING
JANUARY 1, FEBRUARY 5, MARCH 5

Our 1st quarter plate offering will go to the Isabella Project of Santa Paula. Dr. Gabino Aguirre explains that the goal of this project is to help secure funding to provide preschool to all Santa Paula children within the next few years. Ninety percent of brain development happens in the first five years so education during these years sets a child on a pathway to lifelong success.

Project Isabella is contributing funds to existing local programs as well as starting new ones in the local elementary schools. Santa Paula is eligible to receive 80% of the needed funding from State and Federal sources. To receive this funding, Santa Paula needs to secure facilities and qualified staff.

The program currently has more than 100 new openings for students. Our donations will help fund the effort to recruit students by funding community health workers and outreach materials.

As a kindergarten and 1st grade teacher, I saw firsthand the difference preschool education makes for children. We are supporting an extremely worthwhile project. Thank you for contributing.



ON THE WATERFRONT

Director Elia Kazan made no bones about it: this film was designed for retribution. Kazan flirted with communism in his early days, but later renounced it. When he was called on to testify before the notorious House on Un-American Activities Committee in 1952, he felt a duty to name names, and in so doing destroyed any number of Hollywood careers. Many in the industry never forgave him for it, right through to the end of his life. Making **ON THE WATERFRONT** in 1954 was his answer to his critics. When Marlon Brando's character, longshoreman and washed-up prizefighter Terry Malloy says, "I was rattin' on myself all those years. I didn't even know it," the subtext is Kazan's reflection on his past self. The film might not have redeemed him in the eyes of the industry, but it won him eight Oscars, including Best Picture. It also cemented Brando's reputation as one of the most influential and original performers in film, is loaded with memorable scenes, and features a stellar cast including Eva Marie Saint, Karl Malden, and Rod Steiger. And no matter if you take the film exactly as Kazan intended, it still packs a wallop every bit as powerful as Terry's left hook. (1:48)

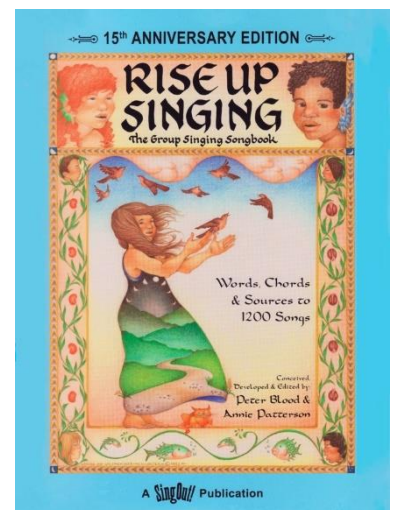

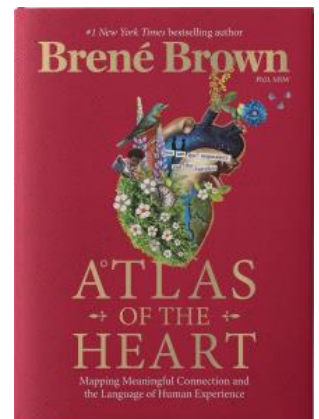
Mary A's: **Thursday, January 26, 2023 11:30 AM**

Program: Historian Judy Triem speaking about Olive Mann Isbell

Historian Judy Triem will speak to the Mary Livermore Society about the fascinating life of Olive Mann Isbell who lived in Santa Paula in the late 19th century and became recognized statewide as the first teacher in California. Isbell Middle School was named to honor her. Olive and her husband Isaac lived during the time of great movement and change in our young country. They were true pioneers forging new paths wherever they went whether it was along the California Trail in a covered wagon, teaching in a stable at Mission Santa Clara, serving famous guests in their tavern in Monterey, working with the Miwok Indians to pan for gold, raising cattle back east and then to Texas during Civil War and finally a return to California to live out the rest of their lives in Santa Paula. 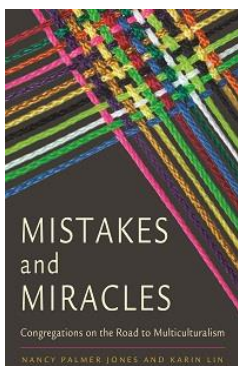

ALL CHURCH READ

Every year we participate in the UUA's Common Read which we call the All Church Read. The 2022–2023 UU Common Read is ***Mistakes and Miracles: Congregations on the Road to Multiculturalism*** by Nancy Palmer Jones and Karin Lin, published by Skinner House Books. The Common Read builds community in our congregations and our movement by giving diverse people a shared platform for reflection and a shared focus for action. Rev. Maddie preached about this book when it was first released several years ago, and it is a natural fit for us as we think about how to welcome our neighbors to our activities and services and be involved with our community here in Santa Paula.



What calls Unitarian Universalists to create multicultural, antiracist Beloved Community? What do congregations need when they embark on this journey? What common threads run through their stories? In *Mistakes and Miracles*, Nancy Palmer Jones and Karin Lin—a white minister and a lay person of color—share how five diverse congregations encounter frustrations and disappointments, as well as hope and wonder, once they commit to the journey. The world has seen much turmoil, pain, and yes, glimmers of hope, in the three years since the publication of *Mistakes and Miracles*. As we enter a Common Read of this book, we find ourselves receiving its report with a changed spirit, an urgent need, and perhaps new hope for multiculturalism and antiracism work in our movement. We will be discussing it together in early 2023 so start reading now!

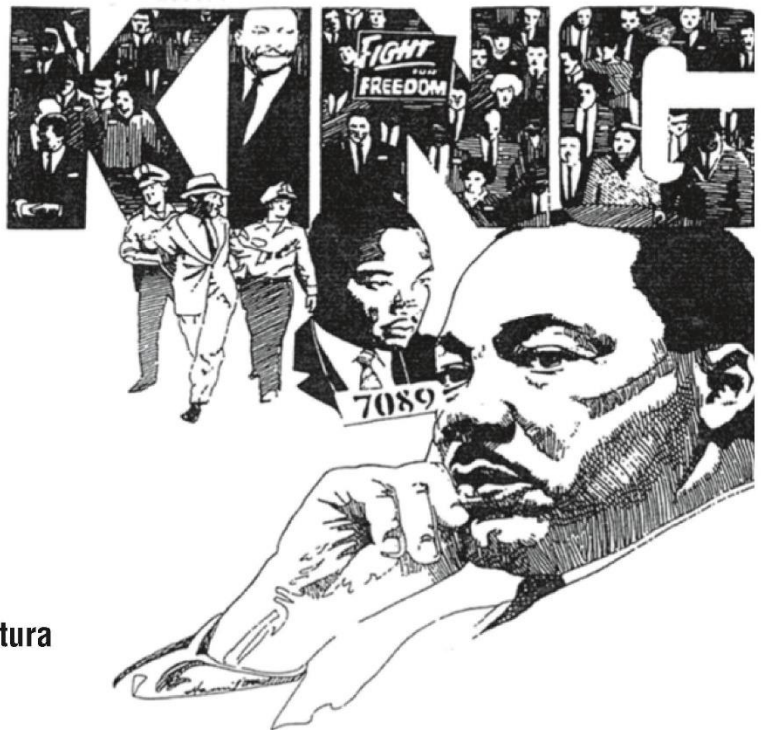

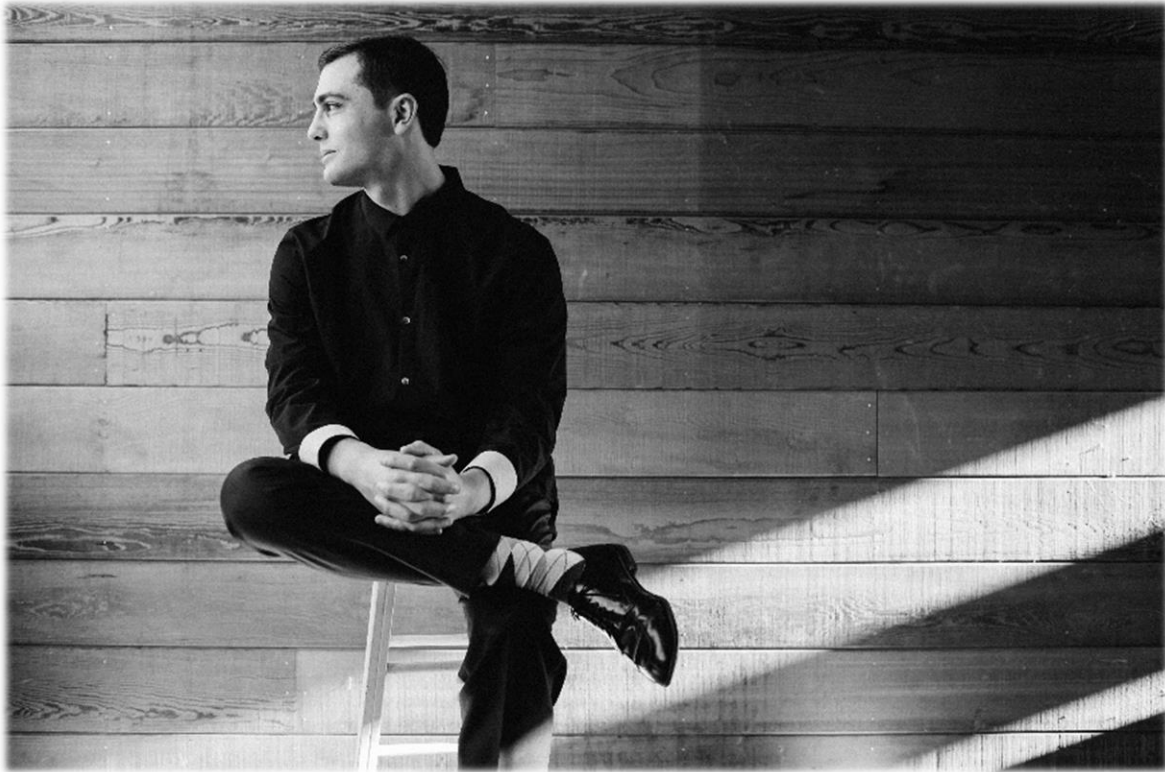
