Dear members and friends,

At this time of year, we can feel the spring getting ready to come in, even as today when I am writing this, I am wearing two sweaters! How are you preparing for spring? I know I am sweeping up the dirt that all the rains spread in my courtyard, trimming back my geraniums, and doing some fertilizing and thinking about when I can put my white cushions back on my outdoor furniture. I am thinking ahead to springing forward my clock so that Sunday, March 12th the service will feel earlier than usual, and the light is growing more. And I am planning with Constancia Leshin for our next earth-based service for the Spring Equinox or Ostara as it is called in pagan, neo-pagan, wiccan, and other circles. Ostara is all about celebrating balance, growth, and new beginnings. Winter has finally ended, and each day slowly gets a bit warmer. Tiny little buds are pushing their way up through the earth and blossoming into a rainbow of colors. We will be marking the Spring Equinox on March 19th.

This month our theme is Vulnerability which we will explore in different ways in our services, Gathering and activities. Wendell Berry wrote:

*It may be that when we no longer know what to do
we have come to our real work,
and that when we no longer know which way to go
we have come to our real journey.
The mind that is not baffled is not employed.
The impeded stream is the one that sings.*

To get you started thinking about vulnerability, here are some questions you might explore:

- Was vulnerability celebrated, encouraged, modeled, shamed or punished in your family of origin?
- What did your family of origin teach you about asking for help? Does that teaching still shape you today?
- Has vulnerability gotten easier or harder as you've grown older?
- What was your greatest "leap of faith"?
- What is your favorite failure? i.e., which of your failures ended up leading you to a gift?
- Has a past betrayal ever left you more protective than you need to be?
- What scares you?
- How would your life be different if you had trusted in vulnerability earlier in life?

One hope I have for our congregation is that it can be a place where we can share our vulnerabilities with each other, and we can feel a sense of new beginnings and renewal as we move toward spring.

2023 1st QUARTER 1st SUNDAY OFFERING **MARCH 5**

Our 1st quarter plate offering will go to the Isabella Project of Santa Paula. Dr. Gabino Aguirre explains that the goal of this project is to help secure funding to provide preschool to all Santa Paula children within the next few years. Ninety percent of brain development happens in the first five years so education during these years sets a child on a pathway to lifelong success.

Project Isabella is contributing funds to existing local programs as well as starting new ones in the local elementary schools. Santa Paula is eligible to receive 80% of the needed funding from State and Federal sources. To receive this funding, Santa Paula needs to secure facilities and qualified staff.

The program currently has more than 100 new openings for students. Our donations will help fund the effort to recruit students by funding community health workers and outreach materials.

As a kindergarten and 1st grade teacher, I saw firsthand the difference preschool education makes for children. We are supporting an extremely worthwhile project. Thank you for contributing.

Featuring seemingly everybody who was anybody in 1932, Grand Hotel became a prototype film in more ways than one. Delivering top Hollywood talent was already M-G-M's calling card. No other studio could assemble so much star power in one film, and audiences began to expect no less. But even more than being a glossy vehicle for its upmarket cast, the film's use of loosely interlocking stories played by an ensemble cast spawned a movie genre, one that reappeared for decades. Adapted from a stage play based on a novel by Vicki Baum, the film incidentally captures something of the flavor of Berlin in the days immediately before the Nazi takeover (a subject addressed far more directly in an obscure 1945 remake). With Greta Garbo, John Barrymore, Joan Crawford, Wallace Beery, Lionel Barrymore, and Lewis Stone, among others. "Nothing ever happens" at the hotel, laments Stone's world-weary character at the start. Then, a great deal proceeds to happen, mostly behind closed doors — where Garbo, forever etched in our collective memory, still wants to be alone. Running time, 1:52.

It is a chance to check in with a small group of members and friends.




March 23, 2023 Zoom Meeting

CARING COMMITTEE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP





Every year we participate in the UUA's Common Read which we call the All Church Read. The 2022–2023 UU Common Read is ***Mistakes and Miracles: Congregations on the Road to Multiculturalism*** by Nancy Palmer Jones and Karin Lin, published by Skinner House Books. The Common Read builds community in our congregations and our movement by giving diverse people a shared platform for reflection and a shared focus for action. Rev. Maddie preached about this book when it was first released

several years ago and is a natural fit for us as we think about how to welcome our neighbors to our activities and services and be involved with our community here in Santa Paula. For that meeting please read the Introduction: The Power of Stories at a Crucial Time (xv-xxxv), Some Words About Language (xxxvii-xxlvii) and Chapter One: The Call of Our Faith (1-25).***
