Message from the Minister

Dear members and friends,

Our theme for September is WELCOME! Welcome back if you have been away. Welcome for the first time if you have been meaning to attend but are just getting around to it. Welcome to the restart of the choir which sings from September through June one Sunday a month. Welcome to new ideas we hope you will share. Welcome to the events of our Spiritual Growth Center and to our next Santa Paula Concert Series event on September 16, Chucumite, in celebration of Mexican Independence Day when we hope to welcome many of our neighbors to our Sanctuary with its fantastic acoustics. Welcome to those who work behind the scenes and those who are looking for a way to contribute their time and treasure. Welcome one and all.

We do many things here at the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula and we hope you will take part in as many as makes sense to you. One of the central parts of our congregation for generations has been Sunday Worship—our service at 10:30 AM—and I love some words that Barbara Pescan wrote about what happens there in UU congregations during Worship so I am quoting her this month. She starts by asking a question that many of you have asked, “How on earth do Unitarian Universalists worship when we have no creed, espouse a range of theological beliefs and hold no object at the center of our worship?” She goes on to say that “it is part of our good news that UUs agree to struggle together—to develop reliable vocabularies of reverence, to practice rituals that lift up the importance of life passages; to keep asking the deeper questions, and to work continually to bring our values and our actions together. All of these practices honor the breadth and depth of human experience.”

The Old English words, *weorthscipe*, translated as worth ship, meaning the practice of holding in view that which is of worth, gives a clue to our Sunday morning practices. The words of the service might touch on world events, science, or the environment; speak of personal experience, the wisdom of sages or world religions; use Humanist, Jewish, Christian, Islamic, or Buddhist teachings or honor Earth-centered cultural traditions as we will on September 17 for the Autumn Equinox also named Mabon.

I plan our worship year to include sermon series, lift up holidays and holy days, and address the whole of our lives together. As Pescan has said, “From time to time we are all in the need of healing or of being exhorted to reach beyond complacency with how things are to see what yet may be. Public worship reminds us that each individual’s life is part of a larger whole across time and culture and nature. Worship at its best allows us to rest for a moment in awe at this interdependent web of life.”

I hope to see you in church Sunday mornings or on Zoom...or at any of our many activities. You are welcome! All are welcome.

Message from Board of Trustees

UUs Welcome Rev. Dr. Sofia Betancourt as UUA President

It is with great enthusiasm that the Unitarian Universalist Association welcomes the Rev. Dr. Sofía Betancourt as the tenth UUA President! We also note that this is not the first time the Rev. Dr. Betancourt has served as leader of the Association. She was appointed co-president for an interim period in 2017 and provided guidance and care during a significant moment in our history. This time, she will be in the presidential role for a six-year term and we are eagerly anticipating her leadership, working together to continue to advance Unitarian Universalism and live our values deeply in the coming years.

Her presidency comes with a number of historic firsts: she is the first openly queer person and first woman of color to be elected UUA president. She has served Unitarian

Universalism for more than twenty years as a religious educator, minister, scholar, and member of the UUA national staff and many volunteer committees at the regional and denominational levels. She most recently served as Resident Scholar and Special Advisor on Justice and Equity at the Unitarian Universalist Service Committee.

Rev. Dr. Betancourt holds a Ph.D. in Religious Ethics and African American Studies from Yale University as well as an M.Div. from Starr King School for the Ministry, where she also served on the faculty. She is the author of *Ecowomanism at the Panamá Canal: Black Women, Labor, and Environmental Ethics* (2022). You can learn more about her in a new Q & A with UU World magazine, including how early life experiences shaped her path to ministry.

As significantly, she also brings to the role theological depth, a commitment to communal care, and a pledge to continue to organize for justice. She has also expressed an appreciation for the diverse voices and leaders in our community as well as for the hard work that UUA staff does every day. We know that Unitarian Universalists across the country and UUA staff will all benefit from her experience, wisdom, and sense of care.

Carey McDonald, our Executive Vice President, expressed his keen anticipation in this way: “We are excited to have the Rev. Dr. Sofía Betancourt at the helm as UUA President to lead us in the next chapter of our faith’s journey. We are already inspired by her deep theology and commitments to community care and imagining the way forward together.”

We are entering an exciting time for both the UUA and Unitarian Universalism. Rev. Dr. Betancourt’s presidency and the General Assembly vote by delegates to continue consideration of changes to the Article II bylaws mark a key moment in our faith tradition. With her leadership, we are positioned to move forward in faithful community, in recognition of our shared values and the important work ahead.

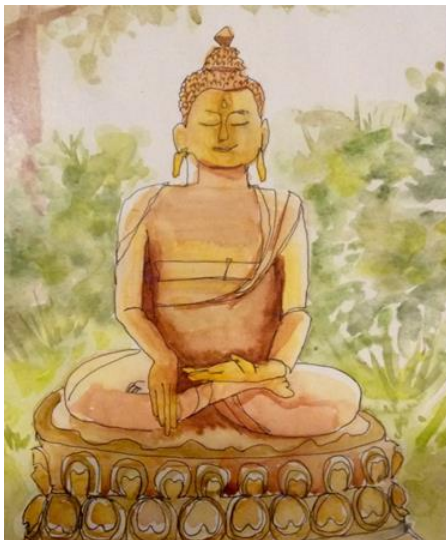

The UFOs are back! With Congress once again holding hearings on them in deadly earnest, it seems they never really left us — least of all our cultural consciousness. This brings us to **THE DAY THE EARTH STOOD STILL** from 1951. It wasn't the first alien arrival film by any means, but coming at the peak of the cold war UFO craze, it is one of the most significant in establishing this distinctive postwar genre. Visitors from outer space in flying saucer films fall into two basic categories: aliens out to conquer the Earth, or to save us from ourselves. The trick of the second type is to leave us guessing about why they are here, at least until all is revealed the last act. For all the inevitable hokum of '50s sci-fi, this is actually quite a thoughtful and well-made film, the work of talented director Robert Wise. The theremin-heavy score is by Bernard Herrmann (his first) — and the film features a flying saucer designed in consultation with Frank Lloyd Wright! Starring Michael Rennie, Patricia Neal, Hugh Marlowe, and a big guy in a silver suit. Pointlessly remade in 2008, but we don't need to talk about that. Until then, Klaatu barada nikto!

We aim to be inclusive of everyone present who wishes to talk or ask questions.

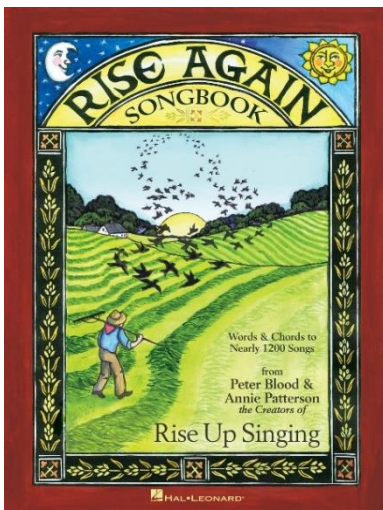

Chucumite is a quartet of musicians who play ‘son jarocho’, the folk music of the southern portion of the Mexican state of Veracruz, on the Gulf coast of Mexico. Chucumite is comprised of John Robles, who plays ‘arpa jarocho’, or Veracruz folk harp; Robert Perales, who plays ‘jarana jarocho’; Sean Hutchinson, who plays ‘leona’, a large, 4 stringed instrument plucked with a plectrum of cowhorn. Robles and Perales have been performing together for over twenty-five years and are described by folklorist and son jarocho scholar Rafael Figueroa Hernandez as “exponents of son jarocho for many years, who as good creative musicians belong to the jarocho tradition but whose music, at the same time, has been influenced by that which is happening around it”. Hutchinson joined the group in 2009. A fourth musician will be announced. Chucumite’s self-titled CD was released in 2009 and rapidly found a warm reception among lovers of world music, and it has sold in many countries all around the the globe. A fourth musician will be joining them for this special event.

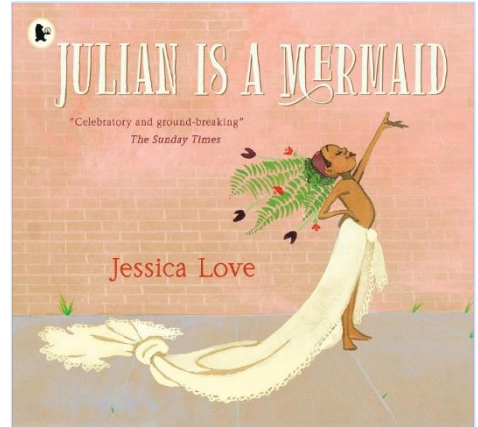

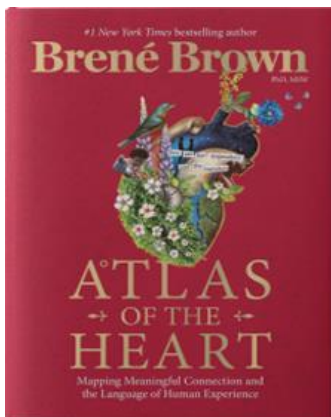
CARING COMMITTEE

CARING COMMITTEE BOOK DISCUSSION GROUP

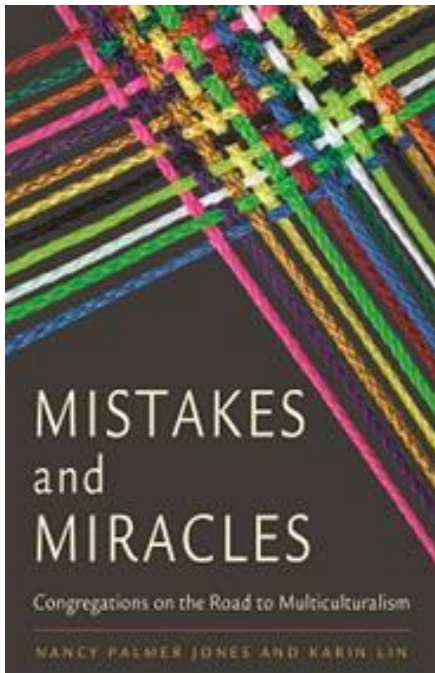
