By now you should all have heard that I will be moving on after this church year, leaving this ministry I have loved for the last nine years. You called me on September 7, 2014, and I returned back East that week to say goodbye to the two churches I had been serving. Wakefield and Milford, Massachusetts as well as my Rites of Passage ministry and my musical career. I began serving you on January 2, 2015. My plan is to be among you doing all the regular parts of ministry that we share together and helping your Board of Trustees and other leadership think about the ministerial transition along with Melissa James from the Pacific Western Area Region of the Unitarian Universalist Association. This will be a transparent process where all voices will be heard, as you look at options for ministry after I leave. But while I am still here, we will celebrate what we have together, I will continue to be present in the activities of the community of Santa Paula and beyond, and day to day life in this small congregation will continue.

Meanwhile, in this month when we celebrate Thanksgiving, I am thinking especially of what I am grateful for, including all that I am grateful for in serving you these last nine years. I am thinking about Generosity, our theme for November and the generosity of spirit we share with each other, our families and friends and the larger community. In no particular order, I am thankful for living in this beautiful valley and my historic home looking out at South Mountain. I am looking forward to this month's Spiritual Growth Center Silent Retreat on November 4 (see elsewhere in this newsletter for more). I am grateful for our earth-based rituals like the recent Day of the Dead and the upcoming Winter Solstice. I am grateful for our staff, especially our Administrator Krystal Johnson, our Tech Team of Monika Murillo and Giselle Larios and for Albie Alamillo who quietly takes care of our building all the while filling me in on history since she has been here since the 90s. I am grateful for the choir and for working with our church musician, Vincent Sorisio. I am grateful for all the board members and other leadership I have worked with since 2014. I am grateful for the larger reach we now have since the pandemic and the grants we received to upgrade our technology in order to accomplish that. I am grateful for all the relationships I have made with organizations in Santa Paula including those I have stood with on justice issues. And I am grateful for all the Sunday mornings we have spent in worship, the memorial services where we shared our sorrow, and weddings full of joy. And I could go on!

What are you grateful for? What do you love about this congregation and where do you see its future vision pointing? How will *you* be part of that vision making? What I wish for you is that you do the visioning that I have talked about over 9 years and that you create the church you yearn for, bringing transformation in your lives and to the larger world. Meanwhile, let us keep love at the center of all we do in the months going forward.

Annual Notice of Membership Requirements for the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula

ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

- A. Any person who is in sympathy with the purpose and program of this church may become a member by signing the membership book, subject to acceptance by a majority vote of the Board of Trustees or the members present at any legal meeting of the congregation.
- B. Membership in this church shall be open to all persons 13 years of age or older without regard to race, color, gender, national origin, marital status, physical or mental challenges, sexual orientation, or gender identification.
- C. Once a person has been accepted as a member, membership rights shall continue as long as they indicate, when asked, the intention to continue as a member, and make identifiable financial or service contributions.
- D. The Board of Trustees shall give written notice of membership requirements in the newsletter in October/November of each year and shall review the membership roll every November/December. Any member who, during the preceding fiscal year, has not met the conditions for continuing membership as stated in the preceding paragraph may be moved to inactive status. Any member who dies or who submits a letter of resignation to the Board of Trustees shall be removed from membership at the next regular meeting of the Board. Any inactive member who again meets the requirements for continuing membership shall be restored to active status by the Board of Trustees at its next regular meeting.
- E. All active members, age 16 and over, are eligible to vote at any legal meeting of the congregation. Active members ages 13 through 15 may vote only on issues that are youth-related. However, active members under age 16 are welcome to voice their ideas and opinions on any issues before the congregation. Inactive members are not eligible to vote.

Rev. Maddie created the Spiritual Growth Center at the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula when she arrived in January 2015. We host a Meditation Practice Group, the Silent Pause, on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 PM alternating between in person with Rev. Maddie and online with Jim Cole. We are adding occasional Sound Baths and other activities. The Spiritual Growth Center is meant to include our adult religious education offerings and spiritual practices, providing opportunities and programs to awaken and sustain love, compassion, service, and personal transformation. Our goal is to help individuals discover how spiritual practice, learning, and community service can transform their lives and move the world toward peace and justice. Our programs are guided by the set of Seven Principles of Unitarian Universalism and the Six Sources they draw from. One of the Principles affirms our intention to accept one another and encourage each other's spiritual growth. Please let Rev. 






TABOO for All Ages (AKA Time for All Ages)

On Sunday, November 19, 2023, we will share "Egg Drop" by

Mini Grey. This charming children's book that takes us on a journey with a curious egg who dreams of soaring through the sky. Despite warnings from other birds, the egg climbs to the top of a tower, only to realize it cannot fly and ultimately falls to the ground. This amusing tale of adventure and discovery has faced controversy and has been banned in some areas due to the book's ending, which depicts the egg's inevitable shattering. Critics argue that the conclusion is too harsh and potentially upsetting for young readers, overshadowing the book's creative narrative and positive themes of curiosity, exploration, and learning from one's mistakes.


