- When you have a child to be dedicated.
- When you're pregnant but wish you weren't.
- When you, or a friend or neighbor would like more information about the Unitarian Universalist faith.
- When you're considering joining the congregation.
- When you'd like to show me what a good cook you are!
- When you have suggestions to make about programs for the Fellowship.
- When you have suggestions for a sermon.
- When you'd like help with committee work or with other congregational activities.
- When there are community issues you'd like to discuss or would like me to be involved with.
- When you're mad at me.
- When you appreciate something I've said or done.
- When you'd like to talk religion with me.
- When you'd like to talk parenting with me as a parent, or as a child.
- When you've had good news and want to share it.
- When you've had bad news.
- When you're feeling overwhelmed.
- When you want to tell me your history with the congregation.
- When you've heard a great joke and want to share it.

I especially like the joke one. But whatever is on your mind, I am open.

Message from Board of Trustees

Transitions are a time for reflection, and a time for looking forward. - Roy Cooper, Governor (D), North Carolina

The Ministerial Transition Team (Ann Hewitt, MaryBeth East, Ken Stock, Leslie Nichols, and Judy Triem) met with members of the congregation on January 14th immediately following the church service. Approximately 15 of us discussed the nature of a contract minister. As noted in the December newsletter, we have been advised by the UUA that we should seek a minister with whom we will contract for one to two years. The participants in the January 14th gathering discussed what we want in a contract ministerial candidate, and what qualities are most important in a minister. We also discussed what ministerial functions are most important to us. A paper handout related to their importance was given to those in the sanctuary, and emailed to those members who did not attend. Results will be shared at the next Ministerial Transition gathering to be held on February 18, immediately following the service. This time we invite all members and all friends of the Church.

Ministerial Transition is a time-bound process. Many changes are coming between now and when our contract minister "settles in" (likely September or October). During the upcoming time period when Reverend Maddie is preparing to leave our congregation, the Board is working to ensure that her transition is as smooth as possible. Now we are all faced with a question. During the time period when we do not have a contract minister, what roles can and should we all play so that our church continues to serve the needs of our congregants, friends and community? This includes our committees and all of us as individuals. Join us on February 18 as we collectively brainstorm this question!



SANTA PAULA CINEMA SOCIETY

Two legendary filmmakers, Preston Sturges and Billy Wilder, had something in common. Both started out as screenwriters, and both had Paramount director Mitchell Leisen to thank for their filmmaking careers — but it wasn't because Leisen meant to do them any favors. Far from it. In fact both of them so detested how Leisen handled their screenplays they lobbied the studio to direct their own work. Wilder broke out in 1942 after cajoling the studio into allowing him to direct his first ("The Major and the Minor") — assuming he'd fail and get the directing bug out of his system. Two years earlier, Sturges was so set on making his own films he agreed to a \$10 salary for his first directing effort, "The Great McGinty." When we first meet Dan McGinty (an underrated Brian Donlevy)

When we first meet Dan McGinty (an underrated Brian Donlevy) he's tending bar in a flyspeck joint in an unnamed country south of the border. Serving drinks to customers even more down-and-out than himself, he tells a story in flashback about his rise from soup kitchen bum to governor under the wing of a crooked political boss (Akim Tamiroff). All goes to plan until McGinty makes a huge mistake — he turns honest! The political and social satire may play a little tame by current standards, and the pace is practically sedate compared to the Sturges screwball comedies to follow, but the dialog still has all of his trademark crack and wit (Academy Award winner for Best Original Screenplay). Also starring the seldom-seen Muriel Angelus as Mrs. McGinty, and William Demarest, among several other future members of the Sturges stock company. (1:23)



ALL CHURCH READ

When we do a UU Common Read together, we share in reflection, learning, and action. A UU Common Read can take us on a powerful journey into what it means to be human and accountable in a world filled with both pain and joy. The Common Read of the Unitarian Universalist Association for the year is *On Repentance and Repair: Making Amends in an Unapologetic World* by Rabbi Danya Ruttenberg (Beacon Press, 2022). This Common Read offers a glimpse into one of our faith's foundational sources, Judaism. Readers explore our own call to be accountable in these modern times as we follow Rabbi Ruttenberg into a framework for making amends offered by the 12th century Jewish physician and scholar, Maimonides. *On Repentance and Repair* invites readers of any faith to explore practices for accountability that can bring us into wholeness and really make a difference in our personal, community, and national relationships.

We will begin our discussions after church and coffee hour on Sunday, February 11 Rev. Maddie's office by considering the Author's Note and the Introduction, pages *ix-x*, and 1-19.
