

REV. MADDIE'S OFFICE HOURS



Loretta Castorini (Cher) receives a proposal of marriage from Johnny Cammareri (Danny Aiello), but the wedding can't take place until he returns from a last visit to his dying mother in Sicily. While Johnny is away she falls hard for his tortured younger brother Ronny (Nicholas Cage). Meanwhile, her plumbing contractor father Cosmo (Vincent Gardenia) is having an affair, which his long-suffering wife Rose (Olympia Dukakis) knows about as she contemplates one of her own with the suave college professor Perry (John Mahoney). It's difficult to keep track of all the romantic entanglements in this film without a scorecard (or a libretto). Who will end up with who? Only *la bella luna* knows!

Is Moonstruck (1987) a movie about an opera or opera about a movie? We do get some La Bohème, but otherwise the film has all the melodrama of opera, without the singing. It finds a space somewhere in between these two worlds, and this is one of its many charms. Created by the prolific director and producer Norman Jewison (who passed away earlier this year) and written by John Patrick Shanley, Moonstruck is a throwback of sorts to the romantic comedies of Hollywood's golden age. It lives in a place that neither exists nor is completely imaginary, an Italian-American Brooklyn that seems real only in the film. You might say it's a place that we hope exists, at least in our imaginations — and isn't this where movies live, after all? Academy Award winner for Cher, Dukakis and Shanley. (1:42)



A UU Common Read can take us on a powerful journey into what it means to be human and accountable in a world filled with both pain and joy. The Common Read of the Unitarian Universalist Association for the year is *On Repentance and Repair: Making Amends in an Unapologetic World* by Rabbi Danya Ruttenberg (Beacon Press, 2022). This Common Read offers a glimpse into one of our faith's foundational sources, Judaism. Readers explore our own call to be accountable in these modern times as we follow Rabbi Ruttenberg into a framework for making amends offered by the 12th century Jewish physician and scholar, Maimonides. *On Repentance and Repair* invites readers of any faith to explore practices for accountability that can bring us into wholeness and really make a difference in our personal, community, and national relationships.

COMMITTEE ON CONGREGATIONAL LIFE


