Her signature playing features in over a dozen of Ken Burns' documentaries, including his Grammy-winning *Civil War, Baseball, Lewis and Clark, Mark Twain, The War* and *Benjamin Franklin*, as well as *The Irish in America*—*The Long Journey Home* and



other PBS documentaries. She has performed at the White House for President Clinton and twice on PBS with the *American Pops Orchestra*, and she has accompanied Scottish singer Jean Redpath on public radio's *A Prairie Home Companion* and on CBS's *Late Show with David Letterman*. As a solo pianist, she has performed vintage music in almost every state of the Union. She is well known to the traditional dance world for her groundbreaking playing with the Bare Necessities ensemble. Her recently-released solo album *I Lift My Lamp—Illuminations from Immigrant America* celebrates vintage music from American immigrants. She has recently collaborated with the Alliance for New Music—Theatre, in Washington, DC, for an evening of theatrical readings of plays about the war in Ukraine. Jacqueline graduated from New England Conservatory, majoring in piano improvisation. She grew up in Pittsburgh and has since lived in Boston and on Cape Cod. She is married to UU minister Rev. Friends of the Santa Clara River/Nature Conservancy



The Santa Clara Preserve spans almost two miles of this amazing waterway and encompasses nearly 1,000 acres of upland habitat and riverbed.

There are few locations on the Santa Clara River that are accessible to the public. Now with the opening of this preserve, TNC has provided a beautiful space for outdoor education, community gatherings, wildlife viewing and hiking. On the preserve we want to give everyone a chance to connect with the dynamic Santa Clara River. The Nature Conservancy has made major strides in protecting one of the most important and intact river systems in Southern California. The Santa Clara River is a vital source of drinking water for the local community, as well as a key resource for many prosperous farms. It also offers some of the last riverside and freshwater habitat for wildlife in the bustling Los Angeles-Ventura region. Despite its local and regional ecological importance, the lower Santa Clara River is threatened by invasive non-native vegetation, intense levee building, poor water quality, conversion from agriculture to urban land uses and increasing development in the floodplain. In 2005, American Rivers designated the Santa Clara River as one of the most threatened rivers in the nation.

Starting high up in the Angeles National Forest in Los Angeles County, flowing down into Ventura County and into the estuary at McGrath State Beach, the Santa Clara River and its tributaries are surrounded by more than 12 million people. As the population soars, urban sprawl bears down on the river and its watershed, threatening:

- The supply and quality of the region's freshwater, including precious groundwater reservoirs that are fed by the river;
- The farmers whose fields and groves line the river and surrounding lands, making a healthy contribution to the local economy and regional identity; and
- The plants and animals within the watershed that rely on the extensive habitat of the river system, including a staggering 16 species within one mile of the mainstem of the river that are federally and/or state listed as threatened or endangered.

Adding to the pressure, 95% of Southern California's river and wetland habitat has already been lost. In fact, this is one of the last rivers in Southern California that remains relatively natural. Other major rivers in the region, including the Santa Ana, San Gabriel and Los Angeles, have been reduced from lush, flowing rivers to largely concrete channels with very little wildlife habitat.

UDD SCHULBERG'S

SANTA PAULA CINEMA SOCIETY

Elia Kazan's 1957 film "A Face in the Crowd" manages to be more just a period piece — it's a chillingly relevant exploration of media manipulation and the rise of demagogues.

The story centers on Lonesome Rhodes (Andy Griffith), a downand-out drifter plucked from obscurity by a small-town radio host, Beth Lucas (Patricia Neal). His folksy charm and unfiltered honesty resonate with audiences, catapulting him to national television fame. But beneath the folksy facade lurks a manipulative narcissist. Rhodes uses his platform to control public opinion, exploit anxieties, and ruthlessly wield influence.

Kazan masterfully depicts the seductive power of media. We see how Rhodes' unvarnished pronouncements, delivered with an air of folksy wisdom, resonate with a disaffected public. The film doesn't shy away from the dark side of fame, showing how Rhodes' ego inflates with each adoring viewer.

Griffith sheds the good-natured persona we remember from TV entirely, portraying Rhodes as a charismatic villain. Neal is equally compelling as Beth, initially dazzled by her discovery's potential, but ultimately horrified by the monster she helped create.

"A Face in the Crowd" transcends its 1950s setting, anticipating the rise of social media and reality television. It serves as a stark reminder of our vulnerability to manipulation and the importance of media literacy in a world saturated with information and misinformation. The film ends on a bleak note, but it leaves a lasting impact, urging viewers to be critical consumers of media and wary of charismatic figures who promise easy answers. MEMBERSHIP OF UU SANTA PAULA

Do want to be recognized as a *new member* on Flower Sunday, June 9? Are you an *official member* of the Universalist Unitarian Church of Santa Paula or thinking of becoming one? Becoming a member of UUCSP is an individual decision, so some people in a family may be member while others are not. While only members can vote on church matters like the budget or calling a new minister, both members and non-members alike are welcome to attend services and other church activities, volunteer, and contribute financially to our congregation. Like many other UU churches, we have dedicated friends who have been active in our congregation, perhaps for years, but have never signed the membership book. Is this your time to make a deeper commitment?

The conditions for membership, according to our bylaws, are these: "This society shall welcome as members any person who is in sympathy with the purpose and program of this church, has signed the membership book subject to acceptance by a majority vote of the Board of Trustees or the members present at any legal meeting of the congregation. Membership is open to all persons 13 years of age or older without regard to race, color, gender, national origin, physical or mental challenges, sexual orientation, or gender identification. Members are expected to make an identifiable financial or service contribution.

If you fall into that "friend" (active non-member) category, you might want to consider becoming a member now. If you have never gotten around to signing the book, but want to become an official member now, it's easy—simply arrange with Rev. Maddie to sign the membership book
