We continue to explore our "post minister" time, hoping and expecting that this is merely a temporary state of being. Dare we call it an interregnum? Probably not a choice word for the UUCSP, where nobody rules! Meanwhile we are discovering all the bits and pieces of running the church, large and small, that we'd tended to take for granted because they were magically handled by Rev. Maddie. No more magic, just some hard work!

Bottom line, our committees are more important than ever to the smooth functioning of the church. This means we are relying on our members to carry more of the load. The Worship Committee is taking on a lot of the heavy lifting these days especially, filling out our Sunday services with interesting and engaging speakers. The calendar is full through January. We can't thank Ruth and the committee enough for their efforts, but we can certainly try!

The Worship Committee reported to the board in August on the need to create a fee schedule for paying honoraria to both lay and ordained guest Sunday speakers. This was just another detail previously handled invisibly by the minster. The board discussed a schedule and adopted it.

The combined Building and Grounds Committee and Preservation committees are tackling a few projects around the church. The broken stained glass windowpane near the piano will finally be replaced by Judson Studios during the second week of September. Plans are being made to create a much more attractive and permanent tech table for the sanctuary. The committee reports that the bar sink in the kitchen backs up because of a plumbing issue. We're not sure if it can be made to drain properly. So for now the sink is covered and should not be used.



SANTA PAULA CINEMA SOCIETY



George Valentin (Jean Dujardin) a is Frenchman who made it big in Hollywood at a time when dialog appeared only on the inter-title cards. But when sound recording came along in the late 1920s, he soon found himself among the casualties — an actor with a perfect leading man's face, but lacking the voice to match. He is forsaken, sustained only by his devoted dog — and soon by Peppy Miller (by name and by nature, Bérénice Bejo), a rising dancing star.

The Artist could have played as a series of Golden Age film tropes, and fans of the period would have smiled in recognition of the in-jokes that others less in the know might miss. But the miracle of this film is it being so much more than a pastiche of the era before spoken word took over the movies. Sure, the plot is drawn from any number of warhorses, including the many versions of A Star is Born, or later films based on the silent-to-sound era — most obviously Singin' in the Rain. This film has everything, and nothing, to do with these progenitors.

The Artist far exceeds being simply an homage to the silent movie era by being witty, inventive, sentimental, and simply a nonstop pleasure to watch from start to finish. The fact that it is shot in a deliberately bygone style, in glorious black and white with (practically) no voice dialog against a wall-to-wall musical score is besides the point. The result is perhaps the single-most beautiful and entertaining film of the last twenty years, one that is only incidentally a movie about the movies. The Artist is guaranteed to satisfy in ways the greatest films of the Golden Age were designed like precision instruments to satisfy. Anyone who says "they don't make movies like that anymore" hasn't seen The Artist. Showered with more deserved awards than can be listed, including Best Picture and Best Director in 2012.
