November 3 Jung, Jazz and the Hero's Journey John Nichols and MaryBeth East

The Monterey Jazz Festival is the longest continuously running jazz festival in the world and is the largest jazz festival on the West Coast. I worked on the stage crew at this festival and served as the stage manager of the 2nd largest stage. After 44 years, I retired so I no longer climbed ladders and worked until midnight. I was asked to write about my years at the festival for a book titled "BACKSTAGE Crew" about all of the backstage workers. I decided to describe my long life backstage using Joseph Campbell's concept of a Hero's Journey that he describes in his 1949 book "The Hero with a Thousand Faces."

Selected exhibits include the Museum of Ventura County, Ojai Art Center, Ojai Valley Museum, Annual Santa Paula Art and Photography Show, Carnegie Art Museum, the California Oil Museum and the Santa Paula Art Museum.




Guest At Your Table (November 17 through December 22]

Just what the world was asking for, a great Ramen Western! Juzu Itami's delightful 1985 Japanese comedy-drama Tampopo is a genre-bending look at Japanese cuisine made with stylistic nods to American Westerns and Japanese Samurai films. The story revolves around Tampopo (Nobuko Miyamoto), a widow who dreams of opening a successful noodle shop. When a kind-hearted truck driver, Gorō (Tsutomu Yamazaki) takes pity on her lackluster cooking skills, he makes it his heroic duty to mentor her. Together, they embark on a whimsical journey to perfect the art of ramen making. The film is an endlessly quirky fusion of comedy, drama, film styles, social satire and food documentary, with many unexpected hilarious plot twists, and characters who seem to belong in a completely different film, appearing along the way. Does this sound like way too much on the plate for one film? Not for Tampopo. The entire package together is perhaps the oddest and at the same time the most endearing food movie feast ever made - a celebration of life, love, loss and the importance of finding the simple pleasures in between.
