#### August 3 Does Everything Really Happen for a Reason? Kate English and Ken Stock

When life turns upside down, many turn to the idea that "everything happens for a reason." But is that comforting idea always true—or helpful? Grounded in psychological research on meaning-making and the Unitarian Universalist value of spiritual growth, this service invites us to explore how we make meaning in times of chaos or grief. We'll reflect on coherence, significance, and purpose—not as givens, but as spiritual practices we build together.

On August 6 and 9 it will have been eighty years since the bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki respectively. These remain, to date, the only times that nuclear weapons have been used during an armed conflict. Today, nine countries are in possession of nuclear weapons. As we reflect on the devastation of August 6 and 9, 1945 in Japan, let us recommit to our work towards a more peaceful world.

August 17 Believe In Miracles? Dr. Rev. Betty Stapleford and Ruth Ricards In these chaotic times, many of us can sink into a sense of despair. And magical thinking is not a true solution. So, why am I proposing that we could believe in miracles? It is because miracles may not just be the result of supernatural forces but of our own actions. So, I invite you to come imagine and create a real dream with me this morning - one that we can all share.

### August 24 The Jewish High Holy Days of Fall: Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur Rabbi Michael Lotker and Marybeth East

The most sacred days in the Jewish Calendar come in the fall with Rosh HaShanah (the New Year) and Yom Kippur (the Day of Atonement). The 10 "Days of Awe" that fall between the two holy days are a time of introspection and seeking forgiveness from people we know and from God. Rabbi Lotker will explain the history and significance of these days with a focus on how the Judaism practiced today developed and differs from Biblical Judaism. He will also bring and sound his shofar, the animal horn traditionally heard on these days. In addition, he will have copies of his book, A Christian's Guide to Judaism, for purchase.

## August 31 At the Threshold Carolyn Bjerke and Ruth Ricards

As summer begins to turn, we find ourselves standing at a threshold, not quite where we've been, and not yet where we are going. In this first service of our shared ministry, we will mark this beginning, honor the grief still present among us, and open our hearts to what may emerge. Together, we will begin to shape a season of becoming, rooted in love, courage, and deep listening.

## Message from Board of Trustees

Board President's Message: Pleas, bees, and more!

First, the plea: Recently, the board began asking for the congregation's help (and especially those who have been issued church keys) with opening and closing the church on Sundays. The board has been covering this duty for some time, but it became something of a burden since the board member had to arrive early and be the last to leave church on every Sunday in three months of the year. We called it "A Month of Sundays" because this is what it demanded.

The solution the board implemented is a signup list similar to what we already have for Coffee Hour. We now call it "Sunday Stewardship," and made these duties a lot less onerous. No one person has to be responsible for "a month of Sundays" — and nobody will be required to both open <u>and</u> close (unless they choose to do both).

"Opening" means arriving at the church by 10:00 a.m., setting out the sandwich board sign, checking the lift operation by the side entrance, then standing at the front door to greet, hand out orders of service, and ask guests if they would like to sign our mailing list. You will generally not need a church key to open, as the Worship and Tech teams will already be there. "Closing" means being the last person out the door, making sure the sandwich sign is taken in, and all of the doors, gates, and windows are closed and locked, lights are off, and heat turned off. You will need keys to close.

The signup list is on a clipboard on the table in the Parish Hall, next to the Coffee Hour signup list. Thanks to everyone who has already taken a Sunday Stewardship opening or closing, and to everyone who signs up in the future!

Now, the bees. Some of you surely noticed last month that we had a beehive established in our building. The bees entered through a ventilation grate on the east side, near the gate. This situation was discovered when Krystal and Eric found dead and live bees in the sanctuary. It turned out the bees were falling down from the hive through the wall cavity to a grate on the inside near the sanctuary floor. After having two beekeepers look at the situation, we found one who was able to remove the grate and the beehive. It was enormous!

A couple more items: We will soon be scheduling a deescalation training session with the Santa Paula Police Department. Discussion on this with SPPD began late last year after our encounter with an individual who seemed hostile one Sunday. This situation has so far not reoccurred, fortunately, but this gives us an opportunity to be better prepared for such incidents in the future. I am told the training is an hour or two. Date and time TBA. I will see if I can get a Saturday for this, but it will more likely be on a weekday during the day.

One final plea: if you have a meeting scheduled, either live at the church or on Zoom, please let Krystal know so it can be added to the church calendar and we can avoid scheduling conflicts.



#### SIP AND CHECK IN TUESDAY AUGUST 12 AT 4 PM ON ZOOM


